By the time you read this Newsletter, we will be celebrating the Feast of Candlemas, which falls on February 2nd and it marks the conclusion of the Christmas and Epiphany Season.

The Feast marks the return of light, a symbol of protection and prosperity. It commemorates the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple where he is recognised by the elderly Simeon as the Light of the people of Israel.

The Feast is also that of the Purification of Mary, since women were required to present themselves in the Temple a certain number of days after giving birth. Some older members of our congregation remember being Churched after childbirth and after that time they resumed normal domestic and church duties.

This Feast Day has been observed since the fourth century A.D. We observe Candlemas by blessing candles which will be used during the year and traditionally people also brought in candles from home for a Blessing. It is a day when we reflect upon new beginnings and hopes for the year to come.

You may well have noticed the slightly longer days and signs of new growth in our fields and gardens. Snowdrop walks and festivals are increasingly common in England and are a delight to behold. They are traditionally called Candlemas Bells.



The most famous Weather Rhyme associated with Candlemas suggests that: if the day be fair and bright then Winter will have another fight. If the day brings cloud and rain then Winter will not come again.

Whatever the weather, may we all shine as a Light in the World during 2024
