When I go for a walk through the lanes, I like to look at the wild flowers in the hedgerows and count how many different sorts I can see. My record is twenty different types of flower in bloom at the same time!



One of my favourite insects is the ladybird - just a tiny seemingly ordinary insect – and yet there are believed to be 47 different ladybird species in the UK and over 5,000 species globally. The most common ladybird in the UK is the 7 Spot Ladybird - which is red with, you guessed it, 7 black spots. Ladybirds can be yellow, orange, brown or red with black, white or red spots. Some even have stripes instead of spots! I am always astounded when I think about the amount of variety in the natural world. It seems that, as ecologists study our world, they discover more and more about it including new species of animals and plants. In 2020 scientists at the Natural History Museum documented 503 new species including scarab beetles from New Guinea, seaweed from the Falklands and a new species of monkey found on an extinct volcano in Myanmar.

How amazing our world is! Seeing the beauty and abundance around me is one of the things that convinces me of the power and love of God. The following words come from one of my favourite Psalms, written by King David to God, 'For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.'



Life is difficult for many people in many different ways but I pray that the beauty and diversity of our world will be gifts that lift our spirits and nourish our souls.
