As I planned and led the different services of Holy Week and Easter, I pondered deeply the events that happened so long ago, events that have had such an effect on so many people over the two thousand years since then. It is not easy to focus on the pain and suffering of Jesus' crucifixion. I went to see the GADOC production of Jesus Christ Superstar which was absolutely brilliant. It was beautifully acted and sung, poignant and shocking by turns. It is disturbing to see Jesus (even if only an actor) being mocked and tortured and killed. In the stage production, the story ends after the crucifixion and some people find that dismaying because, after all, Easter is about Jesus' resurrection, isn't it?

Today we see the events of Good Friday in the light of Jesus' resurrection and we may want to focus on the joy rather than the sorrow but the reality is that both were necessary. Life is a mix of joy and sorrow. The two are inextricably linked.

As we celebrate Liberation Day on 9th May, we remember that our joy comes from the liberation following five years of deprivation and suffering.

A poem by Kahlil Gibran entitled 'On Joy and Sorrow', (from the book of poetry 'The Prophet') tells us, 'The deeper that sorrow carves into your being, the more joy you can contain. Is not the cup that holds your wine the very cup that was burned in the potter's oven?'

As we experience the sorrows and delight in the joys that our lives bring us, I pray that we can know that we have a Saviour who knew sorrows and joys too.


