# **Busy Bats and Chirping Crickets**

The second deployment of the bat detector in the churchyard, for four windy days at the beginning of September, produced very similar results to those from April.

Kuhl's Pipistrelle, Common Pipistrelle and Grey Long Eared bat were all detected in similar numbers to last time. In addition we recorded both the Great Green Bush Cricket (Tettigonia viridissima) and the Speckled Bush Cricket (Leptophyes punctatissima) chirping away on numerous occasions. Sadly I can no longer hear them but it's great to know they are still there.

You may also notice that a bird feeding station has been added on the South side of the churchyard. It contains 3 types of bird food to help a wide range of small bird species. If you happen to notice any birds making use of them do let me know- it would be very useful to know which type of bird too.
