Thought for September 2023

Having just taken the final wedding booked for this year in Forest Church, I was reflecting on each of the occasions. There were differences, of course, in colour choices and styles of outfits; in the number of guests; in the lavishness or simplicity of church decorations; in the choice of music. But the similarities are the things that matter because each couple made the same vows to each other before God and their family and friends, and each couple began a new phase of their life together, a joyful new beginning.

We pray, in Sunday services, for the couples who have been recently married and, at this time of year, we also pray for children and young people as the new term begins. Some will be starting school for the first time or moving to secondary school or into the sixth form. Some will be leaving the island to head off to University or College or starting a new job. There will be changes and new challenges for all of them.

Facing periods of change in our lives can be a testing time. Some people relish the challenge but others feel frightened and insecure. Whatever we are faced with, it is encouraging to remember that God has promised to be with us in all that we go through. One of my favourite Bible passages likens our challenges to water and flames:

Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. Isaiah 43:1-3.

A prayer for those facing change:

Faithful Father, who offers stable love and a grounding presence, help me navigate this change. Amid uncertainty, give me confidence in your abiding presence. Help my sense of loss at what was, not disrupt the potential of new relationships and new opportunities.

During this discomfort, keep me from making drastic decisions that may derail what you have for me and help me trust you no matter what.
