Happy New Year! As we begin not only a new year but a new decade, perhaps we have mixed feelings. None of us knows for certain what this year will hold and, although we hope and pray for blessings, we may also have to contend with some challenges.

On Sunday 5th January we celebrate Epiphany, so called because the word means revelation and, on this day, we celebrate the visit of the Wise Men and the revelation of the birth of Jesus through their study of the stars. Their belief that a new king had been born drew them to Bethlehem and there they discovered the infant, Jesus, and they worshipped him and presented him with gifts. The gifts were symbolic: gold for royalty, frankincense for holiness and myrrh symbolising suffering and pain.

We might think that gold, frankincense and myrrh were not terribly practical gifts for a baby! However, I read that **gold** would have been very useful for a family who had to run away to Egypt and live there as refugees. The gold could have bought food, shelter, maybe even more carpentry tools. Living in a foreign country, the family would have had to hold their religious services at home and the **frankincense** would have been used in their worship. And the **myrrh** – well a pain-killing salve would definitely have been useful for a teething baby growing into an active little boy!

As we move through the Christmas season and face the challenges of 2020, it is helpful to remember the main gift of Christmas – Jesus. We follow someone who knew the challenges of living on this earth. Whatever joys and sorrows you will experience this year, I pray that you will know the strength and presence of Jesus.
